## POST-SURGERY INSTRUCTIONS

The following are your post surgery instructions. One of the Surgical Facility's nurses will go over these instructions with you or your caregiver at the time of discharge.

	Anesthetics and other medications will be in your body for 24 hours, so you may feel a little sleepy. 	Elevate the head of your bed 6-10 inches until your next appointment or until MD tells you it is no longer necessary.
